The third edition of Chemotherapy for Gynecologic Cancers details the tremendous advances that have been made in the medical management of gynecologic cancers since the second edition was published. In ovarian cancer, major clinical trials have helped to define the role of dose-dense chemotherapy, antiangiogenesis agents, intraperitoneal chemotherapy, and maintenance therapies.

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The Society of Gynecologic Oncology and NCCN recommend prophylactic risk reducing surgery between ages 35-45, or at the completion of child bearing, depending on the specific germline mutation for women with Lynch syndrome, BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutations [3-5].

Patients with gynecologic cancers have received benefit from immunotherapy, but these treatments have not yet yielded significant response rates in both the newly-diagnosed and recurrent settings.
