use. Only health

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workers with adequate training in midwifery should use the partograph. They need to be able to observe and conduct normal labor and delivery, perform vaginal examinations in labor and assess cervical dilatation accurately, and plot cervical dilatation accurately on a graph

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against time. The partograph can be used by trained workers at home, in health centers, or in hospitals. The components of the partograph include the progress of labor, the fetal condition, and the maternal condition. Before the partograph can be introduced, a training

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program in its use and appropriate supervision and follow-up are essential. The volume concludes by presenting a strategy to promote wide use of the partograph.

Optimizing outcomes for women in labor at the global level requires evidence-based guidance of

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health workers to
improve care through
appropriate patient
selection and use of
effective
interventions. In this
regard, the World
Health Organization
(WHO) published
recommendations for
induction of labor in
2011. The goal of the
present guideline is to
consolidate the

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guidance for effective interventions that are needed to reduce the global burden of prolonged labor and its consequences.

The primary target audience includes health professionals responsible for developing national and local health protocols and policies, as well as

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obstetricians, midwives, nurses, general medical practitioners, managers of maternal and child health programs, and public health policy-makers in all settings.

Operations research (OR) focuses on the practical application of the knowledge of partographs gained worldwide to date.

WHO recommends

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that health centers
wanting to conduct
OR on the partograph
have at least 500
deliveries per year but
1000 deliveries will
achieve more
meaningful results.

Part IV lists the four
OR protocol
objectives as regards
to the partograph and
hypotheses behind
OR protocol. The OR

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methodology consists of several phases: collection of data prior to introduction of the partograph, introduction of the partograph by means of a training program, evaluation of training, collection of data after introduction of the partograph, and data analysis. OR should state whether or not

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health workers can be trained in correct use of the partograph, partograph reduces prolonged labor and maternal morbidity and perinatal morbidity and mortality, and referrals of women in labor based on abnormal partograph are appropriate. The annexes include

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sample data collection forms and sample results tables for OR on the use of the partograph.
